In Sikh faith, Paramatma (or Waheguru or Ik-Oang-Kaar) represents the one supreme, formless, and eternal reality. This concept is central to Sikh spiritual teachings.

Ik-Oang-Kaar is a sacred symbol and a fundamental teaching, meaning “One God,” which signifies that there is only one divine reality that pervades all of existence. Sikhs believe that Waheguru (a name for God) is beyond any form, free from time, and not bound by any physical or worldly limitations. The essence of Paramatma transcends human understanding, but is still accessible to the devotee through devotion, prayer, and meditation.

This omnipresent nature of Paramatma connects all aspects of the universe, and Sikhs believe that everything in the world, whether living or non-living, is part of the divine essence. This oneness and interconnectedness are essential to Sikh philosophy, promoting unity and equality among all people.
