1. Topographical maps



Topographical Maps:

- □ Show detailed information about the landscape, contours rivers, lakes, forests, roads, and buildings.
- Contour lines are the most prominent feature, allowing you to visualize hills, valleys, and slopes. They also often include symbols for landmarks, vegetation, and human-made structures.



2. Atlas maps

Atlas Maps:

- Collections of maps that cover a wide range of geographical information, often focusing on political, physical, or thematic data.
- Typically include maps of countries, continents, and the world, often with political boundaries, major cities, and physical features like mountains and rivers. Some atlases may also include thematic maps like climate maps, population density maps, or road maps.

3. Sketch maps



Sketch Maps:

- □ Simple, hand-drawn maps created quickly to represent a specific area or route.
- Usually less detailed than other types of maps, often including basic landmarks, directions, and distances. They may use symbols or simple drawings to represent features.

USES OF MAPS

Maps have a wide range of uses across various fields:

• Finding your way: Road maps, GPS systems, and online maps are essential for finding directions, planning routes, and navigating unfamiliar places.

- Maps help travelers plan their journeys, identify points of interest, and estimate travel times.
