Session 3: The laws governing possessions and inheritance in the family

- 1. The Law of Succession Act (Cap 160)- This is the main law governing inheritance in Kenya. It applies to both testate (with a will) and intestate (without a will) succession.
- 2. The Matrimonial Property Act, 2013- Defines matrimonial property as property acquired by a married couple during the marriage. Recognizes both monetary and non-monetary contributions (e.g., homemaking) in determining ownership.
- The Constitution of Kenya, 2010- Article 40: Protects the right to own and inherit property. Article 27: Guarantees equal rights for men and women in property ownership and inheritance. Article 60: Ensures equitable land ownership and distribution.
- 4. The Land Act, 2012 & Land Registration Act, 2012 Regulates land ownership and transfers. Ensures land ownership is legally registered to avoid disputes. Requires family consent before land can be sold or transferred.
- **5.** The Children Act, 2022- Recognizes children's right to inherit from their parents. Protects orphans and minors by ensuring their inheritance is managed by responsible guardians.
- 6. The Marriage Act, 2014- Recognizes different types of marriages (customary, civil, Christian, Hindu, and Islamic). Determines the inheritance rights of spouses depending on the type of marriage.
