### What do you understand about cultural artifacts?

Cultural artifacts are objects, items, or materials that have cultural significance, often representing the beliefs, values, traditions, and history of a society or group. These artifacts can include things like tools, clothing, artwork, religious objects, manuscripts, and even architecture.

Examples of Cultural Artifacts in the Community.

- Traditional Tools & Utensils
   Gourds & Calabashes Used for storing milk, water, or traditional brews.
   Wooden Mortars & Pestles Used for grinding grains and spices.
   Pottery & Clay Pots Handmade vessels for cooking and water storage.
- 2. Clothing & Adornments
- Beaded Jewelry Worn by different ethnic groups to show identity and status.
  Traditional Attire Such as Maasai shukas, Nigerian agbadas, or Indian saris.
  Headgear & Crowns Worn by chiefs, elders, or ceremonial dancers.
- 3. Musical Instruments
  - Drums (e.g., Djembe, Ngoma) Used for communication and celebrations. Flutes & Horns – Played during rituals and ceremonies.

Stringed Instruments (e.g., Kora, Nyatiti) – Used for storytelling and entertainment.

- Weapons & Hunting Tools
   Spears & Shields Used historically for defense and rituals.
   Bows & Arrows Traditional hunting and warfare tools.
- Architectural & Structural Artifacts
   Thatched Huts & Mud Houses Traditional homes in rural communities.
   Carved Wooden Doors & Gates Found in palaces, shrines, and homes.

Sacred Shrines & Stone Monuments – Used for worship and remembrance.

6. Symbols & Ritual Objects

Totems & Clan Symbols – Represent family lineage and heritage.
Masks & Costumes – Used in dances, spiritual rituals, and storytelling.
Sacred Staffs & Wands – Held by elders or spiritual leaders.

# 7. Written & Oral Traditions Ancient Scripts & Scrolls – Used for religious and historical records. Folktales & Proverbs – Passed down to teach moral lessons. Praise Songs & Chants – Performed to honor leaders and ancestors.

8. Ceremonial & Religious Objects

Incense & Ritual Oils – Used in prayers and blessings.

Sacred Drums & Bells – Played during religious gatherings.

Altar Figures & Ancestral Statues – Representing deities or ancestors.
